ORDER OF THE ARROW

Order of the Arrow (OA) is Scouting's "National Honor Society," intended to recognize older Scouts who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives. OA is an entirely youth-led program, promoting camping, leadership and cheerful service to the council and our communities. During a troop election, all Scouts are allowed to vote for eligible candidates who they believe uphold OA ideals. An OA candidate must be 1st Class Rank or higher, have 15 nights of camping, and have proven himself a worthy candidate by showing Scout spirit, helpfulness, leadership and live the Scout Oath and Law daily.

OA elections for Troop 849 will be held during the February 28th Troop Meeting. It is very important that all scouts be in attendance at this meeting. Please make time in your schedule to be present for these OA elections.

PATROL COORDINATORS

Troop 849 is in need of adults to act as Patrol Coordinators to assist the Troop in making the Patrol system operate at its best. A Patrol Coordinator provides *support* to the scouts in areas of leadership, discipline, advancement, and communications.
