Restore a Historic M.B. Building! - Eagle Scout Project February 6/7, 13/14 and 20/21

Hello fellow Scouters. Here's an "epic" opportunity for you to take part in making our City's history come alive!!! Working with the Manhattan Beach Historic Society (MBHS) and its President and fellow Scouter Gary McAulay, as my Eagle Scout Service Project we are restoring the one remaining Manhattan Beach 1910s era Real Estate Office.

Here's what the Manhattan Beach Historic Real Estate Office (MBHREO) looks like today





and, here's a picture of what it looked like over a century ago, and will again after we've finished



After we're done it'll be located at Polliwog Park, right next to the MBHS historic "little red" Beach Cottage/Museum.

We'll be working on this Eagle Project at the City Yard (3621 Bell Avenue) – just one block east from Rosecrans Avenue and next to the Armed Forces Training Center/Armory and Sand Dune Park.

On February 6th-7th we'll be painting the building with first several "primer" coats and then several "finish" coats of paint. Then the following weekend – February 13th-14th -- we'll be finishing-up any left-over painting, including the trim elements and affixing the historic Arts & Crafts era metal building caps to the renovated MBHREO.

Finally, on the weekend of February 20th-21st, we'll be installing the windows and doors; and, 'touching-up' any paint spots that need tending to ... completing the Historic Real Estate Office's "redo" and my Eagle Scout Service Project! [Each day we'll start at 9 am.]
