HIKES

There will be two hikes going out the weekend of May 11-13. One will be an easy hike perfect for new scouts and the other will be a harder one for more experienced scouts. See sign ups at a troop meeting soon.

May 5-6 Los Padres Trail Hike

The hike begins at Upper Oso campground near Lake Cachuma, elevation 1225 feet. The trail ascends five miles to Little Pine Saddle, elevation 4300 feet (the saddle, and the trail, are clearly visible from Highway 154 when you drive over the San Marcos pass.) The trail descends six miles to Santa Cruz camp, elevation 1900 feet. The beautiful camp is situated in a oak meadow on the banks of Santa Cruz Creek. The creek has excellent fishing and swimming areas below the camp.

This time of year, the wildflowers will be gorgeous. Sightings of bears, bobcats, mountain lions, condors, and birds of prey are possible on this hike.

Troop 849 CPR Class

CPR Certification is only good for 12 months. As a result, CPR re-certification is now due for most Troop 849 adults. Troop 849 has arranged for a CPR class on Thursday, May 10 from 6 - 9 p.m. Location is to be determined and will be sent out in a separate email. The class fee is \$30 and will cover both CPR and a second session on First Aid to be given later in May. First Aid does not have to be renewed every year, so you may chose to just attend the CPR class on May 10.

If you are an adult and plan to participate in any Troop overnight outings, please try to make this CPR class. Boy Scout regulations require at least one CPR trained individual on any High Adventure activity. To make our High Adventure treks (e.g. backpacking) a fun and safe experience, we encourage as many adults as possible to take advantage of this training.

Please let me know by May 1 if you plan to attend. This will help the instructor know how many mannequins to bring for CPR. You can reach **Jim Gunderman** at 310-615-5379 and leave a message if he is not there.

PACIFIC CREST TRAIL HIKE

This Memorial Day three day weekend we will be hiking a segment of the Pacific Crest Trail. This year it will be from Big Bear Lake (near Holcomb Valley) south to Fish Creek and climb Grinnell Mtn. ("A" peak).

The trail is pretty flat and we'll hike about 30 miles of PCT and a total of 40 miles including the peak. This backpack counts as a long term training hike, but due to the small change in altitude it is an intermediate level hike. We will leave Friday evening and return to MB Monday afternoon. The Santa Cruz Island Kayak/Hike trip is a spectacular opportunity for both Scouts and Adults. Set out over a three day period, this trip has a lot to offer in plenty of time. It's a beautiful place only 30 miles from Ventura Harbor.

The fee includes roundtrip transportation from Ventura Harbor to Scorpion Harbor, kayak rental, camp reservations and all meals. . Chawanakee Information Night Thursday, May 31 at 7:30 PM

Please plan to attend this *mandatory* Summer Camp information night on Thursday, May 31 at 7:30 p.m in O'Donnell Hall at American Martyrs Church. This meeting is for **both** the parents of Scouts attending **as well** as the Scouts themselves. Please plan to have at least one parent attend the meeting with the Scout. At the Information Night, we will review what preparations you need to make for summer camp. Merit Badge class sign-up forms will be provided at this meeting along with an opportunity for parents and scouts to ask questions about the camp.

Final Chawanakee payments are due on May 31.

Fees for Summer Camp are \$340 for summer camp plus \$100 for transportation, or \$440 total. The \$100 transportation fee covers the Scout's roundtrip on a 47 passenger bus to Chawanakee. No boy will be denied summer camp because of financial hardship.

MEDICAL EXAM NIGHT

Well it is that time of the year again to fill out the required BSA medical forms for Summer Camp and Long Term. The forms are available from the National BSA web site or from the "Forms" page of our web site. We will have a few at the Scouthouse too.

The preferred approach is to have your personal physician complete the form. He can perform as comprehensive an exam as you would like. As an alternate, come to Medical Exam Night at the Scouthouse to get the form filled out. We obviously cannot do a very extensive exam at the Scouthouse.
