## **HIKES GALORE!!**

#### VALLEY FORGE HIKE

Our First New Scout Hike for 2008!! Valley Forge - Saturday May 17th - Sunday May 18th. Easy backpacking trip for new scouts and parents. Leave from Red Box (next to Mt. Wilson) hike in 2.5 miles. Basic camping skills and Tenderfoot-First Class scout skills will be covered. Contact **Mr. Rick Reeley** for more information.

#### **DOLLAR LAKE HIKE**

This is a strenuous training hike that requires previous backpacking experience. The trip will depart Friday, May 9<sup>th</sup> and return Sunday, May 11<sup>th</sup>. The adventure begins at the South Fork Trailhead on Jenks Lake Road, 2.5 miles from Highway 38. The trail begins at the large paved parking lot (6,900') on Jenks Lake Road East and climbs 2.5 miles where it crosses the Wilderness boundary just beyond a short side trail (NE) to a photo overlook (Poop-Out Hill, 7,740') and Wilderness information display. The trail then crosses the Wilderness boundary and continues another 1.7 miles to South Fork Meadows (8,200'). Here the trail forks to the right (west) to Dollar Lake (2 miles, 9,300'). Contact hike leader, **Scoutmaster Dave Rolandelli**, with any questions.

#### LAWS CAMP HIKE

The Laws Camp Hike covers approximately 12 miles over two days. The adventure begins at 5:00AM on Saturday May 10<sup>th</sup> at the Scouthouse for the drive to Idyllwild. The hike starts at the Devil's Slide Trail from Humber Park and climbs nearly 2,000' in less than 3 miles. The basin on top is well worth the trek as it is a beautiful forested area down to Laws Camp. We normally will visit the fire lookout on Tahquitz Peak, or climb to the top of Red Tahquitz. We will return Sunday, May 11<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon. Contact hike leaders, **Mr. Leigh Noda** or **Mr. Jim Gunderman**, for details.

#### PACIFIC CREST TRAIL HIKE

This year's PCT hike will continue from last year. We'll start at Fawnskin, just north of Big Bear Lake, and hike west past Lake Arrowhead to Lake Sherwood. Since this is the northbound direction of the trail, we'll be hiking the same direction of most of the thru hikers. Our trip is about 40 miles over 3+ days hiking generally in a slight downhill. We'll depart Friday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> in the evening and hike to camp away from the cars. We will return on Sunday, May 25<sup>th</sup>. I'm not bringing my tent, just a tarp to keep the dew off. ## **DEEP SEA FISHING TRIP**

Where: Redondo Beach Sports Fishing 233 North Harbor Drive Redondo Beach

When: May 4th, Sunday Arrive at 6:30AM to check in and get gear as the boat will leave on schedule at 7:30AM with or without you. Return time by 12:30PM.

- **Requirements:** Over 16 years of age requires a fishing License that can be purchased for \$12.60 (Cash Only) at Redondo Sports Fishing or The Sports Authority.
- **Cost:** \$30.00 per scout or adult. Bring extra money if you would like to purchase a snack on the boat: Burgers, Fries, Soda, Candy. If you would like to rent a pole it will cost \$15.00 and a Driver's license and deposit will be required. Bring a few extra dollars (\$5.00) for sinkers and hooks but bait will be provided.

Dads, Moms, Brother, Sister, Grandparents, Friends & all are welcome but if siblings or friends are attending they must be accompanied by an adult.
