LITTLE JIMMY HIKE

This will be a good introduction to peak climbing for those that haven't climbed any peaks. We'll depart Saturday morning, June 28^{th} , and drive up highway 2 past Mt. Wilson. From the trailhead at Islip Saddle, there is 2 1/2 miles of hiking to get to camp. We should be there by lunch. After lunch we'll climb one or two easy mini-peaks, depending on the group's desire. There are trails all of the way to the peaks. We'll hike out Sunday morning and arrive back in town about lunchtime.

Difficulty: Introductory - No prior backpacking experience is required.

Profile: Total of 5.2 miles with backpack and 770' of elevation gain.

Peaks: Mt. Islip 8,250' and/or Mt. Hawkins 8,850' Questions see **Mr. Thorpe**!

DRY LAKE HIKE

This is a moderate to strenuous hike where prior backpacking experience is required. The trip will leave Friday evening, June 20th and return Sunday afternoon, June 22nd. The hike covers over 11 miles round trip with approximately 2200' elevation gain. Possible peaks to climb are Grinnell Mountain or Lake Peak.

ROUND VALLEY HIKE

This is a strenuous hike so prior backpacking experience is required. The trip is expected to leave Friday night, June 20th and return mid-afternoon, Sunday, June 22nd. The hike covers over 16 miles and has an elevation gain of 3820'.

LITTLE ROUND VALLEY HIKE

Prior backpacking experience is required for this strenuous hike. Although the trip covers only 9.8 miles, there is an elevation gain of over 3280' which makes this a steep climb. This hike has an opportunity for two peaks, San Jacinto or Folley, both which are rated "C". This trip leaves Friday, June 20th and returns Sunday, June 22nd.

Mr. Bernard is the hike leader.
