MERIT BADGES

Mr. Slocum will be teaching a Climbing Merit Badge class in preparation for our upcoming trip to Joshua Tree. Dates are as follows:

Parents must accompany their scout to this event, as Troop 849 does not provide Leaders to supervise. Merit Badges are a fun way to explore new interests, which may become lifelong hobbies or even a career. Any scout, regardless of rank, can earn a Merit Badge but they are not required for advancement until Star Rank.

ROCK HIKE

The Joshua Tree Rock Climbing trip, October 13th to 15th, provides a unique opportunity for scouts and adults to rock climb in beautiful Joshua Tree National Park. The trip is designed for climbers of all levels, with a focus on introducing those that have not climbed before to the wonders of climbing and rappelling.

ADVANCED ROCK HIKE
