## **COMMITTEE CHAIR CORNER**

You will soon be receiving our annual Troop 849 reregistration letter, asking you to confirm participation in the Troop in 2006 by returning your annual scout registration fee to me in a timely manner (and, optionally, a donation to the Troop).

The Troop Committee has decided to raise the basic annual registration fee for Scouts in Troop 849 to \$60 per year (adults are still \$10, and each younger Troop 849 sibling will be \$30). There were several reasons for this increase: Changes in the Hometown Fair have resulted in reduced fundraising from the Troop's efforts at this event; a desire by the Committee to focus the Troop's leadership on our busy Scouting events calendar (vs. additional fundraising events); and the belief that \$60 per year is still a tremendous bargain in today's world for Troop 849's quality, year-round program.

As always, if this fee (or any Troop 849 expense) creates a financial hardship for your family, PLEASE discuss it with me on a confidential basis and we will strive to work something out. Our policy remains that no boy should be denied a Scouting experience because of money.

Also note that any adult that drives Scouts to Troop 849 events/outings must be registered with the District. Adult registration forms will be available at the Scout House during November. Please take this opportunity to register if you have not already done so.

Thank you all for your tremendous support during 2005 and we look forward to another great year in 2006.
