Fall Shotgun Shooting Event

The fall shotgun shooting event for Troop 849 was held on Saturday, 20 October, at A Place to Shoot in Santa Clarita. Eight scouts and three adults participated as well as SM Rick Reeley (Rangemaster) and ASM Harry Andreas (Instructor). Although the skies were grey and misting, after the mandatory safety briefing, shooting commenced with an array of 12 gauge and 20 gauge Shotguns. Mr. Reeley managed the experienced shooters while Mr. Andreas taught the new shooters the basics and got them hitting targets. We shot clay pigeons from 9:30 until 12:30. In that time we used 600 clays and 2 1/2 cases of ammunition. Most shooters became proficient and several became quite expert at breaking targets. This range allows Boy Scouts to shoot for free under the proviso that they police the area after shooting, so we spent the last half hour cleaning up the range and collected a large amount of trash, much to the delight of the range manager.
