TRAIL TIPS

In this column I'll pass on a few tips to make your hiking experience a little more pleasant. This month the focus is on your backpack.

Tip #1 - Reduce the weight of your pack. We'll have more to say on this later, but for now use lots of plastic bags and take only what you need.

Tip #2 - Be consistent in where you put things in your pack so you'll be able to find them. This is especially helpful after sunset.

Tip #3 - Pack the heaviest items near your body and at the top of the pack. This will help keep the pack from falling "backward". It will also reduce the pressure on your shoulder straps and help you keep your center of gravity where you can more easily control it.
